Five Valuable Sessions

Session 5: Estimating Construction Projects, Project Planning and Scheduling - The benefits to your customer by having a working knowledge of what they do is supported through your understanding of how to prepare a bar chart schedule and CPM, understanding how labor is calculated in the construction industry, recognizing standard construction scheduling terms, and understanding the components of a general contractor's bid and how they affect the project bid price.
